His presentation was specifically arranged for our reunion to commemorate Eisenhower's famous "Don't Join the Bookburners" remarks at our commencement. Another speaker will be N. Bruce Duthu, Samson Occum Professor of Native American Studies at Dartmouth. We expect that some of the

approximately 200 Native American students on campus will be with us for his address. On Monday morning we'll have a private viewing of some of the Hood Museum's impressive collection of Native American Art. We will also be holding some of our events in the Paganucci Lounge in the 1953 Commons building.

We'll try to have as many events on ZOOM as possible. We hope to include the two major presentations outlined above as well as our memorial service, class meeting, and the presentation of our class 70th reunion Dartmouth College Fund gift to Dartmouth's first woman president, Sian Leah Beilock.
